Consolidated Results, Year ending March 2016 Record Sales and Profits for 5 Consecutive Years

MISUMI Group Inc. has announced its consolidated results for the year ending March 2016 (April 1, 2015-March 31, 2016) today. The main results are as follows.

Highlights of the consolidated results for the year ending March 2016

1. Both earnings and profits reached record highs due to meeting the market need for automation and aggressive business expansion of VONA

- The Japanese economy for the year ending March 2016 was weak in some areas due to the normalization of the US monetary policy and deceleration of the economy in developing economies in Asia, such as China, but overall was able to maintain a pattern of gradual recovery. Overseas, while there was a gradual economic recovery in the western countries, there was a continuation of gradual deceleration overall in China and the ASEAN region.
- Under such circumstances, the MISUMI Group continues to strive tirelessly to advance the MISUMI QCT model of achieving high quality (Q) components at low cost (C), on reliably short delivery times (T). With the effect of the expanding need for automation in manufacturing and the need for short delivery times, we have shortened our standard

delivery time in Japan of our Make-to-Order (MTO) items from 3 to 2 days, and expanded our lineup of prices and products corresponding to use by our customers, thus providing a high level of convenience. Furthermore, in order to improve our operational level to match the internationalization of our business, we are working on strengthening our EC base. In our Factory Automation (FA) business, we have completed construction of our Vietnam Plant No. 4, which we had been implementing with an eye toward accelerating our global sure and quick delivery and preparing a tri-polar complementary supply regime involving Japan, China and Vietnam; production has begun at this plant in October. We have also established business entities in regions covering China, Asia, Europe and the United States in order to deepen the MISUMI QCT model culture in each region and to further with assurance the production material process innovation on a global scale.

- As a result, our sales reached ¥240.1 billion, a 15.1% growth year-on-year, led by our FA business incorporating new demand for automation and dies, as well as the growth of our Die Components business and VONA business, which implemented aggressive sales activities.
- Profits were partially absorbed by an increase in costs involving reinforcing our personnel and upgrading our EC base with an eye to aggressive expansion of our business. Consequently, our sales profits were ¥25.6 billion (+8.1% year-on-year), and our net profits were ¥16.9 billion (+18.3% year-on-year).

2. High growth continues centered around our VONA and FA businesses

• Our business performance by business segment for the year ending March 2016 is as follows.

- The FA business increased their earnings by 10.7% year-on-year primarily due to increased sales in Japan and China by aggressively incorporating the expanding need for automation.
- The Die Components business increased their earnings by 7.7% year-on-year primarily due to increased sales in China and Europe.
- The VONA business aggressively expanded sales backed by the largest product lineup in the field of materials indirectly related to production, achieved by the continued increase in the number of makers carried on VONA. As a result, it achieved an impressive growth in earnings of 25.3% year-on-year.



3. Achievement of overseas sales in excess of ¥100 billion per year

• Overseas sales for the year ending March 2016 was ¥111.2 billion (+15.6% year-on-year, +7.9% on the basis of local currencies), in excess of ¥100 billion per year. The overseas proportion of sales was 46.3% (+0.2% year-on-year).

• Our business performance by region for the year ending March 2016 is as follows.

- In Japan, our performance showed a healthy growth as a result of aggressive pursuit of
 meeting the need for automation and expansion of VONA business sales while
 responding to the expanding need for reliable short delivery times.
- In China, in spite of a deceleration of economic growth, manufacturing businesses aggressively pursued automation, resulting in a healthy growth. Meanwhile in the Asia region excluding China and the US, the growth was weak as a result of the decelerating economy and stagnation in the demand for automotive dies, respectively.

4. Dividend payout ratio of 25% maintained, increase of ¥2.37 year-on-year

- MISUMI Group Inc. determines its dividend payout policy based on a comprehensive determination of expansion of investment and business base in order to achieve sustained growth and corporate value improvement, strengthening its financial base, and improving capital efficiency.
- It was determined that the dividend payout ratio would be 25% from the second half of the year ending in March 2012, and it is our intention to maintain this standard for the end of the year ending in March 2016 as well.
- Therefore, in line with the business results for the year ending in March 2016, the dividend for the second half of the year is scheduled to be \frac{\text{\frac{4}}}{8.5} (+\frac{\text{\frac{4}}}{1.98} \text{ year-on-year}). Thus, the dividend for the year, including the dividend paid out at the end of the second quarter of \frac{\text{\frac{4}}}{3.37} (+\frac{\text{\frac{4}}}{0.39} \text{ year-on-year}) is scheduled to be \frac{\text{\frac{4}}}{15.42} (+\frac{\text{\frac{4}}}{2.37} \text{ year-on-year}).
